Gail P & Debe have begun painting and doing much needed TLC in the Caswell House.


The **Preservation Assistant** team has been maintaining our buildings by helping keep things beautiful and clean!

TUESDAY CREW

In October, the team helped set up and take down our Trick-or-Treat entry way (pictured below). They also built a frame for the entry way that we can reuse over and over again to make it easier in the years to come. They leveled out the ground by where we normally position the entry way so it is more even and less of a tripping hazard. A few Tuesday Crew members helped take down Scarecrow Row, too!

In the winter months they helped hang (and take down) holiday lights to illuminate the Village. They've been working on creating a sign for Niles-Barnard that will incorporate a bell from our collections.
